

## **EMPLOYMENT GROWS IN SOUTH JERSEY**

The unemployment rates in South Jersey are higher than the unemployment rates for the United States as a whole. However, even with a higher unemployment rate, it seems as though the area is doing well when it comes to employment, as there are signs that more jobs are being created and more people are finding work in South Jersey. Many of the jobs that were created in Cape May were in the leisure and hospitality sector, along with the trade and transportation sector. For Atlantic County, there has been a growing trend of more jobs being made available than there were within the same timeframe during the previous year.
