JOB SEEKERS HEAD TO EMPLOYMENT EXPO

There were a number of employers and organizations that chose to participate in the event, which took place on Thursday. Many of the employers were accepting applications right on the spot. The branch manager for Randstad, Lafay Presberry, said, "We have customer service jobs for a financial services company that is expanding into the area, and light-industrial jobs in Lincolnshire and Vernon Hills." Preseberry also said, "We're trying to get people in for the managers to start their training as soon as possible." Presberry spent plenty of time at the expo collecting filled out questionnaires from those who arrived early. Presberry also let everyone know that the company was planning on responding to all applicants within a 24-hour time frame. Those who were looking for long-term work in which a resume would be required were even able to receive assistance on how
