

IT IS POSSIBLE TO FIND JOBS OUTSIDE YOUR NETWORK

Go the extra mile in all aspects of the interview process since you don't have the reference to rely on. If there was more than one person in the interview, write a card for each one that is tailored to them directly. These extra steps will help the interviewer remember you aside from everyone else.
