

VICE PRESIDENT FOR EXXON MOBIL RETIRES



Lucille J. Cavanaugh, the vice president of Human Resource for the Exxon Mobil Corporation, has recently announced her plans to retire on the 1st of April this year. Her retirement will be coming very shortly, as it is only a few months away. Cavanaugh has, in the meantime, provided over 34 years of service and is ready to hand the torch over to someone else. Farrant was transferred over to the United States in 2006 and has been there ever since. His current position is located at the headquarters of Exxon Mobil, which is located in Irving, Texas. He has been working within his most recent position since the summer of 2011.
