We employ approximately 38,500 people and have the capacity to process more than 36 million birds per week for a total of more than 9.5 billion pounds of live chicken annually. Pilgrim's is ranked among the largest U.S. corporations, with net sales totaling \$7.5 billion in fiscal 2011." Well it looks like the company is going to be getting rid of a significant number of workers in order to make ends meet. The company is getting ready to get rid of about 400 workers at its Hamilton County processing facility in the upcoming month. Since so many people are going to be put out of a job in the layoffs this is enough to qualify as a mass layoff action.
