

WOMEN PIONEERED THESE TRADITIONALLY MALE JOBS IN THE WORLD

Filmmaking

Despite this fact, the tech, math, engineering and science industries are dominated by men, with less than 25 percent of these jobs held by women today.

Musical Drummers

Whenever people think of a drummer for a band, they typically think of a man or start naming male drummers. This was not always the case. In fact, the position of drummer was originally dominated by women. Nowadays, drums are seen as a masculine musical instrument associated with rock stars and marching bands. But, ancient paintings have shown us that women were some of the world's earliest drummers. They would use drums to bring about fertility and birth and were very sacred to women.

Brew Masters

Beer is one of the most popular forms of alcoholic drinks in the world and it was once dominated by women. Some of the original brew masters in the world were women because the job was viewed as a domesticated position. In today's beer manufacturing industry, less than one percent of employees are women.

Medical Doctors

In what is still an industry dominated by men, the field of medicine was once dominated and pioneered by women. Women worked as healers during Ancient times in Greece and Egypt, but they were banned from practicing medicine when the church required doctors to attend college. Women, in the Middle Ages, were not permitted to attend college.
